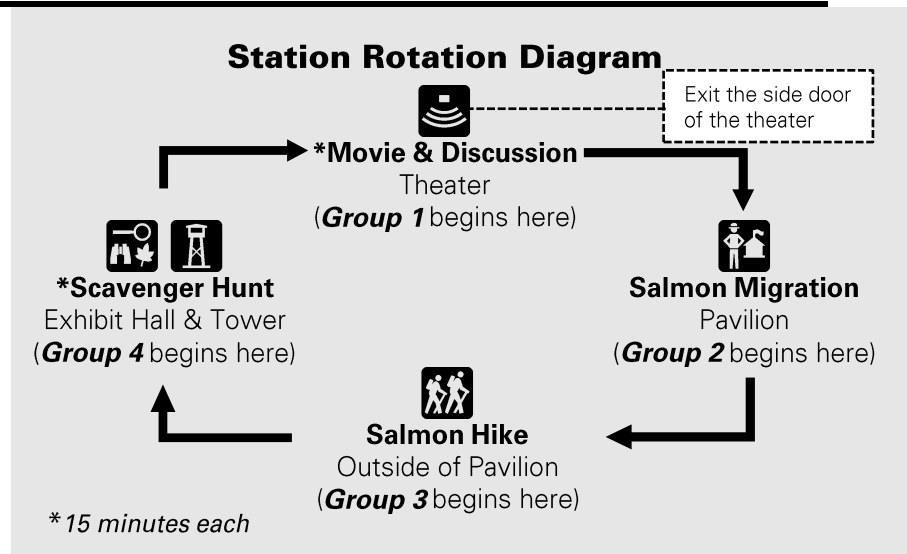

* Allow 5 minutes travel time between stations to ensure your group arrives to the next station on time

Summary of Stations

- Prior to arrival, assign all chaperones and students into one of 4 groups: 1-2-3-4
- Each group contains **1 adult for every 5 students**. Adult chaperones guide students throughout the day from one station to the next.
- Each group travels to the next station according to the **Station Rotation Diagram**

- Legacy of Fire Movie & Discussion | Theater (Teacher & chaperone-led)**
After the movie, chaperones facilitate a discussion and students answer the questions in their booklets. At rotation time, **exit out the side door** of the theater to the Forest Education Pavilion. Wait for staff to open the pavilion doors to begin the next rotation.
- Salmon Migration Activity | Forest Education Pavilion (TFC staff-led & chaperone-assisted)**
Students will simulate the seaward and return migrations of Pacific salmon through a dice-rolling activity. Chaperones will assist as volunteers during the activity and help manage the students.
- Salmon Hike | outside the pavilion (TFC staff-led & chaperone-assisted)**
TFC staff will lead students along the trails and explore the salmon lifecycle and why salmon needs forests. Chaperones will assist as volunteers during the activity and help manage the students.
- Salmon in Our Streams Scavenger Hunt | Exhibit Hall & Lookout Tower (Teacher & chaperone-led)**
At the beginning of the rotation, half of the chaperones will guide their subgroups of students to explore the exhibit hall and the other half will explore the lookout tower. Students will record observations and discoveries in their scavenger hunt booklets (**provided**). Subgroups will rotate after 15 minutes spending half of the time in the exhibit hall and half of the time in the tower.
