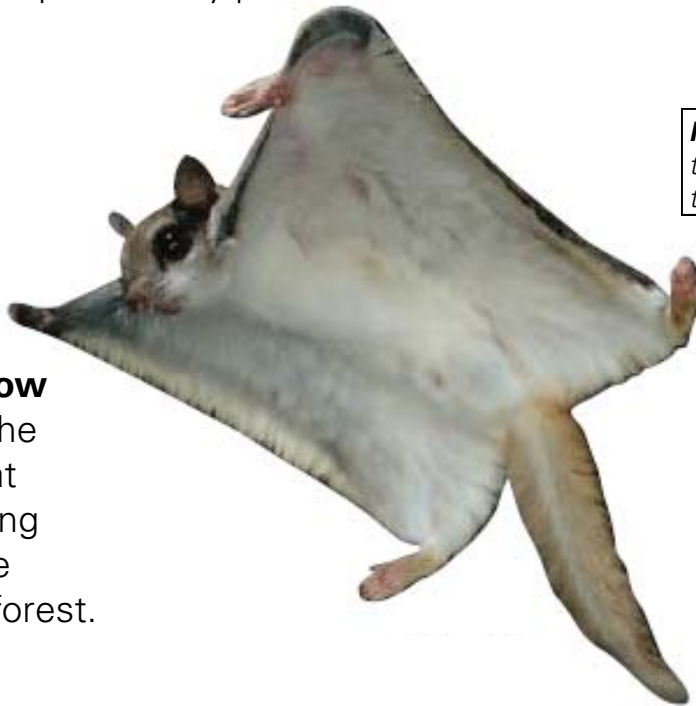
Animals have different types of body parts (adaptations) that help them move around, find food, eat food, defend themselves and raise their young.

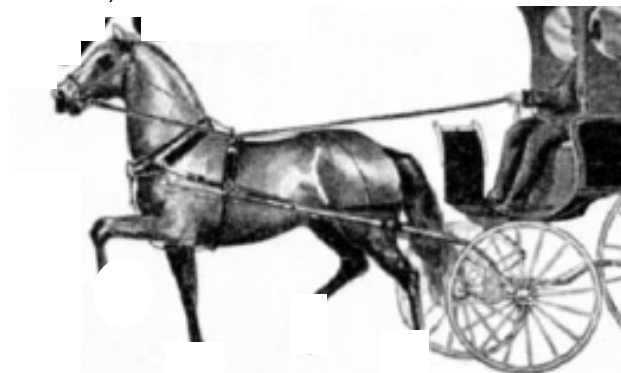
